


Shapes into nature



The outside world is beautiful. Get outside or look out of your window and see how many different colours you can see. Find the same colour colouring pencils and add each colour below. How many colours can you find?



Flowers, trees, grass and even the sky can be used to create art. Have you ever heard of cut-out silhouette art? It's where you draw anything you like, cut it out and use the paper you have left to make an outline picture. You can see an example below.



- On the next page we've drawn a butterfly. Cut out the butterfly's wings, trying to leave the outside white paper together as much as possible. You might need to tape your paper back together again.
- Now, take your cut-out silhouette outside. Look around and find something you like the look of. It could be a bush with flowers, some bright green grass, the sand on a beach or even the night sky.
- Hold your cut-out up in front of it.
 Can you see how the outside makes it look like you've coloured it in? It's almost like a little window into the outside.
- Now you've seen it with your own eyes, ask an adult to help you take a snapshot with a camera or phone so you can remember it. Try experimenting with different backgrounds, which one's your favourite?
